Re: Disposition of Official Complaints

Dear Board Members:

The Georgia State Election Board ("SEB" or the "Board") is the only government entity with the authority to promulgate rules governing Georgia elections, enforce those rules, investigate election irregularities/problems, and take the actions necessary to prevent reoccurrence.

An enormous amount of time and treasure has been invested by many based upon the expectation that the State Election Board would investigate and address the litany of faults and failures we have meticulously documented, evidenced and submitted to you in the form of official complaints. Now, after more than two years and eleven filings (not one resolved), Chairman Mashburn informs us that the SEB has decided it will no longer be investigating complaints pertaining to the 2020 General Election.¹ But we have seen no genuine investigation of the 2020 General Election by the State Election Board.

The citizens of Georgia have no reason to believe their votes were counted accurately, only once, or counted at all. We have filed eleven very serious complaints over the past two years that include material violations of Georgia law, but we can't even get the Board to provide us with the status of those complaints, with the exception of the following.

A few weeks ago, the Board sent us notice that our complaint, SEB-2023-025 was on the agenda

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for the December 19, 2023, meeting.² For context, SEB2023-025 was filed on July 08, 2022, and details how the November 03, 2020, Fulton County election results included 20,718 ballots for which there are no records- that is- no provenance for the ballots or tabulators on which the ballots were purportedly scanned. The same complaint specifically identifies 3,125 ballots which were scanned and counted twice. Additionally, 17,852 ballot images are missing from the official record of the Recount which no one can explain, perhaps because there are no acceptable explanations.

A year and a half after we submitted the complaint *and* the Georgia Governor's office referred the same to the SEB, we thought that this matter would finally be addressed. But then at 3:30 pm on the Friday afternoon before the meeting we received an email from the paralegal for the SEB (who is always considerate and helpful):

"Good afternoon,"

Please accept this email as notice that the case SEB2023-025 has been continued from the agenda, and will not be heard at the December 19 SEB meeting.

Best regards,"

The cryptic message is all that was received. I replied asking <u>why</u> the case was continued, to which she responded,

"The investigations division asked this afternoon that the case be continued from the meeting.".³

SEB2023-025 has been at the SEB since July 08, 2022. Chairman Mashburn, the SOS investigator and the Secretary of State's General Counsel have had more than sufficient time to perform their due diligence but instead- have refused. The SEB has shown it is unwilling to exercise the authority and oversight with which it has been vested by the Georgia state Legislature. We have been professional, respectful and patient, but the SEB has failed in its mission. Make no mistakewe will not fail in ours.

Therefore, if the SEB is unwilling to genuinely acknowledge and address the material faults of Georgia's election systems and processes, then we are left with no choice but to also seek remedy through the court and public forum.

The matters currently at issue are:

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- 1. Complaint rejected by the SEB's Chairman without review.
- 2. SEB-BI-2023-001 The SEB's authority to investigate the Secretary of State. See Mr. Moncla's Amicus letter separately attached.
- 3. Complaint "administratively dismissed" by the Secretary of State last year.
- 4. Complaints on the December 19, 2023 SEB meeting agenda.

1. DEKALB COUNTY BALLOTS COUNTED IN FULTON COUNTY

I filed a complaint on October 20, 2023, probably after or before midnight.⁴ I received an email rejecting the complaint at 2:15am on a Saturday morning from Chairman Mashburn, less than two hours after the complaint was filed.⁵ I know you are dedicated public servants, but I did not see any meeting of the State Election Board called on an emergency basis to justify the immediate rejection. Let me remind you - that complaint was to explain how the most perfect election in Georgia history counted several Dekalb County ballots in Futon County races- (three separate times for three separate counts). It is a small but representative example as to how the failures of the 2020 General Election were realized- as detailed in the many complaints we've submitted for your review.

Following Mr. Mashburn's edict rejecting the complaint and blanket directive that the Board would no longer be investigating any complaints regarding the 2020 election, a competent member of the Board reviewed the complaint and based on the responding email, justifiably seemed to be in disbelief- or confused. In an email only to the other members of the Board, Mr. Mashburn falsely assured them that the ballots in question had not been counted, and that the complainant (this author) was making assumptions that were false.⁶ Had Mr. Mashburn actually read the complaint, he would have learned that the ballots were in fact counted- not just once, but three times (Let the record show that the assertions made in the complaint were not assumptions but true and correct statements of fact -and that the Chairman was confused).

After receiving confirmation that the ballots were counted and other questions were answered, the member requested that an investigation be opened into the matter; however, we have received no further communication regarding the complaint. That is- except for an email from Mr. Mashburn reminding members of the SEB's policy not to publicly discuss open investigations – referencing the very complaint for which he stated an investigation would not be opened. It seems Mr. Mashburn values the ability to unjustly criticize complainants and mislead members of the Board behind closed doors- almost as if he is aware that his statements are untrue, but perhaps I am confused.

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Based on the Chairman's late-night missive it appears that I am apparently also confused about the language of the statute establishing the State Election Board and its duties. The repeated requests for investigation into the matters I and others have raised over the past two years may seem to be annoying, but as I read the statute (and I have discussed this with my attorneys), the State Election Board has a <u>duty</u> to investigate complaints. O.C.G.A. § 21-2-31 (2022) provides as follows:

"It shall be the <u>duty</u> of the State Election Board:

(5) <u>To investigate</u>, or authorize the Secretary of State to investigate, <u>when</u> necessary or advisable the administration of primary and election laws and frauds and irregularities in primaries and elections and to report violations of the primary and election laws either to the Attorney General or the appropriate district attorney who shall be responsible for further investigation and prosecution."

I hasten to remind the Chairman that those things that he cannot explain, such as ballots from another county being counted in Fulton County, demand investigation. Especially when the same evidences failure of nearly every stage of the election process. An investigation is *required* to determine- not only how the ballots of another county were counted in three (3) separate counts, but how they escaped the many safeguards that are purported to exist, such as reconciliation, adjudication and a hand-count/audit. Failure to investigate would be grossly negligent.

Please let me know if you or your attorneys disagree with this analysis of the statute. I would be happy to have attorneys representing me or others discuss this with competent counsel representing the State Election Board. Board members, please confirm that this complaint is being investigated and provide a case number for the same.

2. <u>SEB-BI-2023-001 Rossi Complaint</u>

The duty of the SEB seems to be at issue in another complaint. More specifically, whether the SEB possesses the authority to investigate the Secretary of State in the matter of SEB-BI-2023-001. As some of you know, this inquiry was borne from Mr. Joe Rossi's complaint detailing the 36 errors of the 2020 General Election hand-count audit (SEB 2021-181). Those errors were independently verified by the Governor's office who then formally referred the matter to the SEB for investigation.⁷

The Governor's report details the 36 errors which falsely added 6,695 votes to the hand-count that do not exist (1,038 to President Trump; 5,618 to Joe Biden).⁸ In response, the SEB opened investigation SEB 2021-181, but Mr. Mashburn, sua sponte, removed the Secretary of State as a

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Respondent. Ultimately the SEB referred the case to the Attorney General who also verified the errors.

The Attorney General quietly resolved the complaint by privately negotiating a consent agreement in which Fulton County acknowledged the errors but attributed the same to unintentional clerical/data entry mistakes. Absent from the agreement was the fact that 35 of the 36 "errors" benefited Joe Biden, yielding not a random or equivalent distribution, but 35:1 (Biden to Trump) odds more analogous to those of Roulette.

The same agreement failed to disclose the scope, size, or details of the errors and merely described a non-determinative amount. The agreement did not even facilitate the correction of the erroneous results posted on the Secretary of State's website and did absolutely nothing to prevent the same from happening again in the future. Absolutely nothing.

What's more, a matter as serious as the fact that the <u>hand-count/audit did not verify the</u> <u>November 3rd results</u>-but did include 6,695 bogus votes that do not exist, the <u>SEB voted to adopt</u> <u>the consent agreement- sight unseen</u>.⁹ The three (3) members of the Board who voted to ratify the document are attorneys of law, presumably educated in complex principles of legal theory, which I suspect also includes the basics of ethics and the importance of reading a document *before* ratifying it. Allow me to suggest that the attorneys reference the Rules of Professional Conduct before acting on behalf of Georgia citizens with such gross negligence and reckless disregard.

Based on the same facts of SEB 2021-181, Mr. Rossi filed a separate complaint specifically naming the Secretary of State as a Respondent. In response, former SEB Chairman, Retired Federal Judge William Duffey, officially opened an investigation but it was immediately thwarted by the Secretary of State's General Counsel, Charlene McGowan. In an email to Judge Duffey Ms. McGowan declared that no such investigation would be opened by "this office".¹⁰

Soon thereafter, Judge Duffey resigned, and Mr. Mashburn became the acting Chairman. In response to insistence that the complaint be investigated, Mr. Mashburn has "invited" Mr. Rossi to file a brief showing why the SEB has the "...specific, explicit authority under which you contend the Board has jurisdiction to hear Complaints against the Secretary of State.".¹¹

Altruistic in the belief that Chairman Mashburn is not attempting to further delay, deflect and deny that which has been factually established and presented to the Board multiple times, and that he is now, at the end of his term, sincerely inviting clarification as to the responsibilities and authority of the Georgia State Election Board, like Charlie Brown attempting to kick the football- I submit the separately attached Amicus letter.

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3. EARLY VOTING TABULATION COMPLAINT

Just a few weeks ago I sent each one of the Board members an email specifically requesting the status of ten (10) complaints we have filed over the past two (2) years, and I have yet to receive a response. I did, however, receive from a concerned citizen the response he received for an Open Records Request which included information on one of the very serious complaints regarding the 2020 General Election we filed in March of 2022.¹²

Shown below, a memo received shows the complaint was opened and assigned a case number (SEB-2022-024) on April 04 of 2022 and closed "administratively" by the Secretary of State May 09, 2022, for what the investigator describes in the footnote as a "technical issue".

On 04-04-2022, the Secretary of State Investigations opened case SEB2022-024 Fulton County Scanner Tabulator Issue. After a review of the case and Complaint (see exhibit 1) this investigator has learned this case is a technical issue and Fulton County has been made aware of this Complaint and the fact that the SOS is closing this case administratively.

This complaint has been closed <u>for over a year and a half</u>, has not been presented to the board to determine the disposition of the case. These facts alone reveal nothing short of gross negligence- but regrettably there's more.

The evidence we presented in the complaint (Fulton County's records certified by the Fulton County Custodian of Records) showed prima facie material violations of Rule 183-1-14.02. Not one or two hearsay tales of "technical violations" but we evidenced over <u>175 material violations</u> of nearly every section of the rule. Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. 183-1-14-.02 states in part:

"The memory cards shall remain in the ballot scanner at all times during the

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advance voting period until the polls close on the day of the primary, election, or runoff."

The security seals were broken, and the Advance Voting tabulator memory cards were swapped out during a live election- and NOT because of capacity (10,000 ballot images)- and NOT because there weren't enough tabulators. Thirty-five tabulator memory cards were replaced with memory cards of unknown provenance.

In addition, at the end of early voting on October 30, 2020, the tabulator seals were broken (again) and the memory cards were removed from ALL tabulators with the cards still "open" (the memory cards are not encrypted until the card is closed and the results are aggregated). Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. 183-1-14-.02 requires the tabulator to be sealed and transported to the place of tabulation until the polls close on Election Day.

Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. 183-1-14-.02 (13):

"At the end of the advance voting period, the registrars shall record the election counter number from each ballot scanner on the daily recap sheet. The ballot scanners shall be shut down and sealed."

Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. 183-1-14-.02 (14):

"By the close of the polls on the day of the primary, election, or runoff, the registrars shall deliver all of the ballot scanners used for advance voting and all other absentee ballots received to the election superintendent or the tabulating center."

Four (4) days later- the memory cards were inserted into different, surrogate tabulators and the results (poll tapes) were printed. The mandatory tabulator verification and reconciliation process required by the same rule was entirely circumvented.


Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. 183-1-14-.02 (15):

"After verifying the seal number and the integrity of the seal on each ballot scanner, the election superintendent or tabulating center personnel shall open each ballot scanner and turn on the power. The election superintendent or tabulating center personnel shall then compare the numbers shown on the election counters of the ballot scanners with the numbered list of absentee electors and the absentee ballot recap form to verify that there are no discrepancies. If there is a discrepancy, no further action shall be taken until the reason for the discrepancy has been determined to the satisfaction of the election superintendent."

What's more, the tabulators print their own serial numbers and protective counters (tabulator odometer)- NOT the one that scanned the ballots- thereby masking the identity and counting

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record of the scanning tabulator. The result is fraudulent poll tapes bearing the serial number and protective counter number of different machines. The following are all from Advance Voting tabulators from the 2020 General Election:



Notice all five have the same serial number (fifteen poll close tapes bear serial number "AAFAJIV0104") and the protective counter number is also the same, rendering the poll tapes, which are the hard-copy legal representation of the tabulation, not only **fraudulent**, but effectively meaningless.

To add just another "technicality", <u>ALL 138 Advance Voting poll tapes representing some</u> 295,000 ballots (facilitated by a former Dominion employee and foreign national), are unsigned, unwitnessed, and uncertified, in violation of:

Ga. Comp. R. & Regs. 183-1-14-.02:

"The election superintendent or tabulating center personnel shall cause each ballot scanner to print a minimum of three tapes showing the vote totals as cast on that ballot scanner. Three witnesses shall sign each of the tapes or shall write on the tapes the reason why they will not sign the tapes. One copy of the results tape for each ballot scanner shall be made available for the information of the public. One tape shall be placed into an envelope (or reusable document storage container suitable for the same purpose), provided by the election superintendent along with "poll worker" memory cards from the ballot scanner."

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The same encompasses approximately sixty percent of all ballots cast for Fulton County's 2020 General Election - and thus forms the fraudulent and hollow basis for certification of the official results.

This is a very serious matter that requires immediate investigation. The rules cited herein were promulgated and codified by this body- the Georgia State Election Board. The records are Fulton County's and certified by the Fulton County Custodian of Records. The violations are material and incontrovertible. Failure to properly investigate this complaint is an act of gross negligence.

The investigators are undeniably also confused as they are acting against prima facie violations of the **Board's own rules**. Your inaction, Mr. Mashburn, is allowing it.

As is the case here, you are permitting the Secretary of State's office to dismiss complaints administratively without the Board's review. It is not under the Secretary of State's jurisdiction to dismiss complaints as the legislature has vested the State Election Board with the duty to investigate (O.C.G.A. § 21-2-31 (2022)).

I hereby officially resubmit the same complaint to the SEB and due to the Board's failure to investigate this very serious matter and have concealed the disposition of the case for more than a year and a half, I am seeking emergency expedited review. Please provide written confirmation that SEB2022-024 will be investigated and do so by December 19, 2023.

4. <u>COMPLAINTS ON THE DECEMBER 19, 2023, SEB MEETING AGENDA</u>

Further reasons for my confusion lie in correspondence from the SEB which provided notice that two of our complaints are on the agenda for the December 19, 2023, meeting. One is SEB 2023-025 (the "Moncla-Rossi Complaint" of July 8, 2022) which the Governor's staff thankfully reviewed and referred to the SEB, for which the letter states <u>a violation was found</u>,¹³ and the other is SEB 2022-348, for which <u>no violation was found</u>.¹⁴

First, it is <u>not</u> the job of the SOS's investigator to make such a determination (again), and the State Election Board has not delegated its authority to investigators to "find" a violation or resolve a complaint. The job of the investigator is to investigate and report to the Board. The Board can then consider the evidence generated, weigh the written submissions, and give the parties an opportunity to be heard. The Board can then deliver a finding which the parties are satisfied with or can appeal. Due process considerations protect the accused; the right of the citizens to petition their government for redress of grievances protect the accusing party- the people.

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In addition to the inherit importance of a credible complaint detailing a determinative quantity of illegitimate votes, there are specific incidents at issue in the Moncla-Rossi complaint that are of interest and may be relevant to the cases of those recently indicted under criminal RICO charges. This is an important issue, and I would encourage you and the Board to take this matter more seriously, not only because of the conflict of interest in the Secretary of State investigating itself, but also because the Secretary of State's investigators have repeatedly shown themselves unwilling or incapable of even understanding the complaints.

Finally, I'd like to address the directive included in the letters, which states:

"Only the respondent, as the party who is accused of a violation, is entitled to be heard on the allegations. The respondent, as the party accused and any witnesses that the respondent might call, but no other party or parties, will be afforded the opportunity to offer input for the Board to consider in determining whether a violation was committed and the disposition of the matter."

For the Board to prohibit an opportunity for the complainants to respond is antithetical to the principles of transparency, accountability, the adversarial process, and the rule of law. The Board must adopt a policy and procedure that strikes a balance between efficiency and equity, because silencing the people just won't do.

For these reasons and that the disposition of these matters by this Board may very well influence the weight attributed to the evidence by the trial court, and because the very liberties of those charged could be at stake, I hereby formally request a special exception to the unacceptable policy defined above and ask that complainants be afforded time (at least one hour with additional time to answer questions from the Board) for the next scheduled SEB meeting to present information and evidence in response to the report of the investigators for SEB-2023-025, SEB-2022-348, and SEB-2022-042. I ask that SEB-2022-348 be continued accordingly. As we have stated -- and as the Board has experienced -- we confidently stand behind the complaints we have submitted and welcome the challenges posed by the adversarial process.

Lastly, we understand that the Board has not had a budget (until recently) and was "reliant" upon the Secretary of State's investigators, but this is why we have performed the investigations, spent the resources, invested the time and delivered to you meticulously documented evidence and sourced, cited complaints that need little more than verification.

You have asked for facts, Mr. Mashburn, well, we have given you the facts. We've given you the facts, records, evidence and explanation, all of which you have continuously ignored, avoided and thwarted- or allowed the SOS's office to dismiss. Allow me to be charitable- given your propensity to deny that which we have put before you, reject the credible complaints we have submitted without investigation, and to portray that the 2020 General Election was somehow acceptable, is nothing short of willful misconduct.

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Allow us to stand before the Board and present the facts. Then, Mr. Mashburn, you can enlighten us in a public forum, and help relieve the state of confusion from which so many of us seem to suffer.

Re: Official Complaint Detailing Faults of the 2020 Fulton County Recount

Dear Board Members:

As you know, I have submitted ten complaints to the State Election Board (the "Board" or "SEB") over the past two years, some with Joe Rossi, some with David Cross, and some alone.¹ I hope you appreciate the complaints have been rigorously researched, detailed, and supported by documentation. Each one shows – at the very least – probable cause to show multiple and repeated violations of Georgia law. These complaints at least deserve a detailed investigation and explanation of why I and my fellow complainants are wrong. We are happy to be corrected. So far, not a single complaint has been seriously investigated by the Board. Mr. Mashburn, is this what you were referring to when you stated that "…*every complaint is treated with the same respect.*"? I hasten to correct you, but the proper term in this context is *disrespect*.

I understand that the Board cannot properly investigate because it does not have the necessary funding. I understand that the Board relies on investigators from the Secretary of State. That, of course, is obviously a severely deficient process – many of these complaints

show wrongdoing, gross negligence, or incompetence by the Secretary of State, its officers, and the counties that it is charged with supervising. It is not a shock to understand that the Secretary of State is not going to investigate itself. Further, we understand that when the Board "refers" a matter to the Attorney General for "investigation" (as was done, for example with Case No. 2021-181 on March 16, 2022), the Attorney General's office has no investigators to investigate, and simply is used to delay action on the referral. (In the case of 2021-181, which showed 4,583 non-existent Biden votes had been falsely added to the total vote count in Fulton County, the Attorney General reverted with a meaningless consent decree after 15 months – a consent decree which was not even read by the Board before it was approved. How is that consistent with your duties to the citizens of Georgia, much less to a person seeking that the law be followed?

In the instant Complaint (our Complaint Number 11), we provide a small ballot-level analysis (with pictures) which demonstrates, once again, that Americans have no reason to trust – and every reason to question – Georgia's disgraceful election system. The ballots referenced in this complaint should never have been counted, and while the number is small (only 5), the fact that even one exists shows a massive breakdown in processes in the 2020 election that allowed ballots from one county to be processed and counted in another county. This is another serious complaint, and we hope that you take your duties to investigate seriously. See O.C.G.A. 21-2-31.

THE FAILURES REVEALED BY FIVE ATTACHED BALLOTS

By comparing ballot images and data from the original November 3, 2020, machine count of the votes in that election (hereinafter "Original Count") and those of the machine recount which commenced on November 24, 2020 (the "Recount"), we identified significant and obvious irregularities.

For purposes of this Complaint, please note that we identified five (5) Dekalb County ballots which were included and counted in Fulton County's Original Count², Hand Count/Audit, which began on November 13, 2020 (the "Hand Count Audit"), and the Recount.³ An impossible succession of multiple failures would have to precipitate a ballot from one Georgia county to be counted in a different county, much less five ballots -- for five different precincts and three separate counts.

We can identify at least the following failures by Fulton County and, for its failure to provide oversight to the obvious errors, the Secretary of State:

- 1. Ballot envelope barcode scan for voter credit. Upon receipt of absentee ballots, Fulton County scans the envelope barcode which is unique to the voter who requested the ballot and marks the voter as having voted. Please investigate how an absentee ballot from Dekalb County could be processed by barcode without anyone spotting these obvious errors.
- 2. Voter Signature Verification Signature verification is performed using a comparison of the signatures on file with the county verifying the signature, based on the ballot application or the original registration. How could Fulton County have properly verified signatures from voters not resident in Fulton County?⁴
- 3. Scanning Ballot Definition The Dominion Voting Machine tabulators only read ballot styles for which they are programmed and Fulton County's tabulators are only programmed to read Fulton County ballots. The Dekalb ballots were each of a different ballot style and for different precincts, of a different county. How were these ballots read by multiple Fulton County tabulators? (All five ballots were scanned independently on different tabulators.)
- 4. Adjudication Three (3) of the five (5) Dekalb ballots survived the adjudication process, and each was processed by a different adjudication panel. How could these ballots have survived the adjudication process? Could the persons who adjudicated these ballots be investigated? It seems appropriate to at least ask the question, even if, as we stated above, the Board has no real investigatory powers.
- 5. Hand Count Audit The Dekalb County ballots also survived the Hand-Count/Audit and were undetected. These same ballots appear again in the Recount after not being flagged in the Hand-Count Audit. Who conducted the Hand Count? What explanation exists for not spotting a Dekalb County ballot in a Fulton County Hand Count?
- 6. Machine Recount- The Recount marks the third count and opportunity to catch and correct the included foreign ballots, and marks yet another failure. How were the Dekalb County ballots scanned and counted once again? Again, all the scanning was done on different tabulators.

⁴ This may be an easy investigation. We know from the affidavit of Mr. Mark Wingate, a member of the Fulton County Board of Elections (attached), that County officials told him that they had not conducted any signature verification, in violation of O.C.G.A. 21-2-386. Of course, while this has been apparent for some time, the Board still approved a slap-on-the-wrist settlement agreement with Fulton County in June without any public disclosure of the erroneous hand count results or correction of the public record.

The implications of the five ballots at issue in this complaint are indicative of a much larger problem that is of grave concern. This is not one incompetent volunteer asleep at the switch, but the systems and processes in place to protect the integrity of the election seem to have failed at every step and through three different counts.

Furthermore, there is no way that the tabulators should have been able to read these ballots (for either machine count) and there is no way they could have been read accurately. There is no way the signatures of voters from another county were verified, nor could those voters have received credit for voting.

This begs the question – and requires an investigation -- what voters were these ballots attributed to and how? Is a corresponding voter even necessary?

Based on my understanding of what Georgia purports to claims as its "secure" election systems, there is no suitable, theoretical, or even remotely plausible explanation for all systems, protocols, and procedures to have failed for each of these ballots, over three separate "counts" – which the Secretary of State claimed showed no errors. There is no excuse, but unless you can answer these questions in an investigation, there *is* one conclusion -- Georgia's election system has completely and astoundingly failed. This is not an isolated "anomaly", but rather widespread, multiple-layered, successive failure only possible through intentional system manipulation and/or malfeasance.

Please report the results of your investigation, hopefully before the next election. It seems that the citizens of Georgia and the United States have waited long enough to have a real investigation into the 2020 election and all the anomalous activity we have identified in our complaints. If you choose not to investigate, as you have in the past, this will simply be further evidence of a gross dereliction of duty; we reserve all rights to use any legal means necessary to prevent continued failure of enforcement and oversight.

Please call me with any questions or comments, as I stand behind our work, but I would prefer communication in writing. It is important to document yet another failure by the State Election Board, which will supplement the extensive record for the inevitable next steps. Thank you.

AFFIDAVIT OF MARK WINGATE IN SUPPORT OF AMENDED COMPLAINT FOR DECLARATORY JUDGMENT AND APPLICATION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS

The undersigned Affiant, being duly sworn on his oath, deposes and says that:

1.

My name is Mark Wingate, I reside in Fulton County, and I am of legal age to make this affidavit.

2.

I was a member of the Fulton County Board of Registration and Elections (the "BRE"), a

position I have held since 2017, when I was nominated by the Fulton County Republican Party

("FCRP") and appointed by the Fulton County Board of Commissioners ("BoC"). I submit this

affidavit in support of the FCRP's AMENDED COMPLAINT FOR DECLARATORY

JUDGMENT AND APPLICATION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS filed concurrently herewith

(the "Second Complaint").

I have personal knowledge concerning the matters discussed herein and am under no disability that would prevent my testimony.

4.

3.

I have now seen the initial COMPLAINT FOR DECLARATORY JUDGMENT AND APPLICATION FOR WRIT OF MANDAMUS AND INJUNCTIVE RELIEF filed with the Fulton County Superior Court on June 29, 2023 and accepted for filing on June 30, 2023 (the "Initial Complaint"). I am aware of and have been asked to provide this record of my experience in connection with the Second Complaint.

5.

I have served on the BRE since 2017, when I was nominated by the FCRP. During that six-year term, I have become aware of the intricacies of election operations and maintenance in Fulton County and throughout Georgia. I voted not to certify the results of the 2020 general election because, as a result of my service on the BRE, I was not comfortable with the processes and procedures used to derive the final election results, including, among other things:

(a) The voter registration counts in the active/inactive voter rolls, which

I had questioned for months;

- (b) The Board was told that Fulton County did not perform any signature verification on any absentee-by-mail ballot in the 2020 election;
- (c) The Board was never provided chain of custody documents that it requested;

- (d) The Board was never provided the surveillance footage of the drop boxes that we requested; and
- (e) There had been no answers to the allegations of misconduct in the final counting at State Farm Arena used to certify the 2020 election.
 - 6.

While I take my duties to the citizens of Fulton County seriously and have exercised those duties without regard to partisan interests, I have always considered myself a representative of the FCRP on the BRE. The statute authorizing my nomination and requiring my appointment limits the appointees to the BRE to two representatives from each of the two parties that obtained the highest number of votes in a recent election. I have read that statute and understand that my duties as a member of the BRE include my duties as a representative of a political party and an obligation to communicate with the FCRP. The BRE website has always identified me as one of the two "Republican Members."

7.

I am aware that the FCRP nominated Messrs. Mike Heekin and Jason Frazier as their new appointees to the BRE. I became aware that Messrs. Heekin and Frazier were presented to the BoC for appointment on June 7, 2023, but the BoC rejected the appointment of Mr. Frazier. To my knowledge, that was an unprecedented act in Fulton County or any other county that I have become aware of. I am aware that the BoC again rejected the appointment of Mr. Frazier at a subsequent BoC meeting on June 21, 2023.

8.

Prior to the scheduled end of my term on June 30, 2023, I had made my intentions clear to members of the FCRP and BRE that I had no intention of serving another term. I have

suffered serious health issues for several years from progressively worsening back issues. This fact was well known to all members of the BRE and to Ms. Patrise Perkins-Hooker, who had served as counsel to the BRE.

10.

I was therefore surprised when Ms. Perkins-Hooker sent me an email on Sunday night, July 2, 2023 (attached as Exhibit A). I read the email as saying that I was "required" to stay on the BRE. In the email, Ms. Perkins-Hooker stated she "hate[d] to let me know" that "our bylaws state that you serve until your replacement is named."

11.

I expressed my surprise in my response to Ms. Perkins-Hooker. But I knew that she had served as the attorney for and counsel to the BRE, and was aware of the facts and the law, and trusted her to give me correct advice.

12.

Based on a subsequent email from Mr. Chad Alexis, Senior Assistant County Counsel for Fulton County, I became aware that the FCRP had served the BoC with a Temporary Restraining Order ("TRO") seeking to prevent the BoC from appointing a member of its own choosing to the BRE.

13.

No representative of or person associated with the FCRP contacted me about the Initial Complaint. Although I considered myself a representative of the FCRP, I did not expect to receive any such communication since I believed my term had expired on June 30, 2023.

4

I knew that Ms. Perkins-Hooker had also recently been appointed to serve as the Chair of BRE. I subsequently was led to believe by Ms. Perkins-Hooker and Mr. Alexis that Mr. Frazier had been appointed to fill "my" seat and that, because he had not been appointed, I would be required to stay on the BRE as what I understood to be a "placeholder" in "my seat" until a replacement was named.

15.

I do not know if any similar representation was made to Dr. Kathleen Ruth, the other outgoing Republican Member of the BRE, whose term had also expired on June 30, 2023. I do not believe that the appointments of the FCRP are specific to individual replacements on the BRE.

16.

At 5:33 pm on July 5, 2023, Mr. Alexis sent an urgent request for an affidavit attached as Exhibit B, asking for an immediate signature and notarization. Mr. Alexis stated that the FCRP had "served" the BoC with a "Temporary Restraining Order" because of the "vacancy" on the BRE. Mr. Alexis' email continued as follows:

[P]er your email exchange with Chairperson Perkins-Hooker, your willingness to serve until a successor is appointed (as per the Fulton County Code) ensures that no such vacancy occurs. To that end, we have attached an Affidavit to this effect for your review and signature, and to be notarized. This affidavit is needed for the TRO Hearing set for tomorrow, so we will need the fully executed document no later than tomorrow at 9:00am. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns. Based on the emails with Ms. Perkins-Hooker and Mr. Alexis, both of whom I knew as lawyers, and their citing of the "Fulton County Code" and "bylaws," I understood I was required to act as they directed.

18.

Mr. Alexis prepared the affidavit without any input from me. He had a notary drive to my daughter's house, where I was staying, at approximately 7:30 pm on the night of July 5, 2023 to witness my signature on the affidavit he had prepared. I was not advised as to how the affidavit would be used in litigation and was not advised to contact counsel. The notary did not leave me with a copy of what I was asked to sign and I have never received a copy of that notarization.

19.

I trusted Ms. Perkins-Hooker to provide appropriate legal advice, as I felt that she had done in the past. I knew that was also the role of Mr. Alexis. During my tenure on the BRE, I have been involved in several lawsuits, and I have, like other BRE members, relied upon the advice of counsel to direct our submissions. I was told only that the affidavit was needed for court hearing on July 6, 2023.

20.

Not until after the July 13 Zoom meeting of the BRE did I know that future surgery was scheduled that would make it difficult for me to continue in my role as a "placeholder" on the BRE.

On July 14, 2023, I sent Ms. Perkins-Hooker an email (reproduced as Exhibit C) and told her that I had back surgery scheduled for August 9, 2023 with a long period of recovery. I notified her that I was "discontinuing my placeholder services on the BRE."

22.

Ms. Perkins-Hooker responded to me and interpreted my email as a "resignation. (See Exhibit D.) She added that "Your resignation should be sent to all of the members of the Board of Commissioners and the Clerk because they are the appointing authority. I have copied the others that you did not include on your previous email for that purpose." She also stated in that email that, "Pursuant to Fulton County Code Section 14-37, the Board of Commissioners will have the power to appoint a successor for you as an interim appointment."

Even though the Board will not be opening this investigation for the reasons stated above, we encourage you and any others who wish to continue to look into the 2020 election to do so.

Mr. Mashburn,

Nearly three weeks ago- I filed a complaint regarding several Dekalb County ballots being included and counted in Fulton County (albeit inaccurately) for the November 3rd count, the hand-count/audit, and the machine recount. In response you informed me that the Georgia SEB would no longer be initiating investigations into 2020 and therefore would not be opening an investigation into this matter. Then you send an email to members of the Board which states,

"...counties receive ballots all the time from voters in the wrong county. They are not counted and not included in the totals.".

Mr. Mashburn, Fulton County's own records say otherwise- which you would have realized had you actually read the complaint.

I provided the actual ballot images for each ballot and the corresponding 3rd page AuditMark which details the votes counted for each contest. When a ballot is rejected by the tabulator there is no ballot image and there is no AuditMark. Moreover, when a ballot is rejected, it does not go to adjudication as these ballots did. Last, the Dekalb County ballots were in fact counted -not once, not twice, but in three separate counts. To remove any doubt whatsoever, these ballots are easily found in the Cast Vote Record for Fulton County for the original count and again for the Recount. The Dekalb county ballots were counted by Fulton County- that is a fact established by Fulton County's own records and one that is easily verified by referencing the CVR. Either of them.

In an email to members of the Board you state, "*He's made a lot of assumptions that are simply incorrect*.". Allow me to be charitable in the belief that you were simply uninformed and unknowingly mislead the members of the

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Board. I trust the clarification I have provided restores your perspective and that you now understand the gravity of the complaint. Certainly, the matter of several ballots from one county being scanned, credited, signature matched, counted, adjudicated, hand counted, and then counted once again for the recount- in another county, raises the gravest of concerns. I believe the only failure which could possibly make it any worse is the Board's refusal to give the matter proper review.

I have not been given the courtesy of a reply, and I still await the status of the 10 official, serious fact-based complaints filed with this Board over the past two years. I, and more importantly the good people of Georgia, would respectfully appreciate a response from any of you.

Dear Dr. Johnston and Members of the Board,

Dr. Johnston raised some very good questions in response to the complaint I submitted. I'll provide answers to those that I can.

"Were these Dekalb County ballots counted by Fulton County?"

Yes, the Dekalb ballots were in fact counted in both the original count and the machine Recount. We know this for at least three separate reasons. 1) The ballot image files were each included in the Cast Vote Record (for both counts), along with the votes attributed to the ballots. 2) The AuditMark specifically details those votes and how the tabulator read the votes. Additionally, several of the ballots were adjudicated. Ballots are not adjudicated that "are not counted". The adjudication process is to specifically determine which votes count.

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The determinations were made, and the votes were officially included in the count as is detailed on the adjudication portion appended to the AuditMark. 3) Another irrefutable point which establishes that these ballots were in fact counted is that they are also included in the Recount. Aside from the technical verifications, logic and deduction provide the necessary clues that these ballots were counted because they also appear in the Recount. Because the Recount was after the hand-count/audit, these ballots also survived the hand-count/audit as well.

"Review of the ballots and the audit marks make no sense. Many of the choices on the ballot images are different on the audit mark, including some votes for other candidates and overvotes."

I agree that they make no sense; however, it is not surprising that a ballot style that is not programmed to be read would yield unexpected results. The problem is that the ballots should have never been read as they should have been rejected. The fact that they were not rejected is the first failure.

"Even the ballots that show adjudication on the audit mark appear to have erroneous choices. How could the ballot image and the audit mark(and adjudication) be so disparate? Does the adjudication imply that a person or team visually reviewed a Dekalb County ballot for a Fulton County election? "

This question I cannot answer. The fact that they are so disparate is another failure in addition to the problem of being from a different county.

"How could a Fulton County scanner "read" a Dekalb County ballot? Would not this ballot be rejected by the scanner?"

The scanner should not have been able to read the ballot and it should have been rejected. Full Stop. The way the ballot definition is identified and authenticated should have caused the tabulator to reject the ballot with an "Invalid Ballot" error.

As for your remaining questions, they are not for me to answer. I will say that Mr. Mashburn's explanation and description of the issue is incorrect. The ballot envelope barcode is scanned upon intake of the ballot, and that should have flagged the ballot as being from another county. The ballot envelope would still be intact at that point and could have been properly forwarded to Dekalb county. The ballot should have never left the envelope in Fulton County. As I stated in the complaint, for the instant scenario to have taken place would have required a succession of failures across multiple systems, tabulators, adjudication boards and three separate counts.

After nearly three years of research, I can only describe Georgia's elections as an unmitigated disaster. I do not say this because of political bias nor do I want to hurt or discredit anyone. I started filing these complaints in an effort to help remedy what is broken- and make no mistake- it is broken. One expert, Professor Duncan Buell, described Fulton County's election like this: ""I have not examined or heard of an election in the United States with errors of this type or this magnitude".



Dear Members of the State Election Board,

I write to refer the following matter to the Board for its review and consideration. As you know, I called on Georgians with information about inconsistencies or complaints regarding the 2020 election to notify the proper state authorities. To date, the complaint outlined below is the only instance where a complainant has referred an issue to my office *and* provided all requested information for me and my staff to fully evaluate its veracity.

On September 3, 2021, Mr. Joseph Rossi, a retired executive from Houston County, Georgia, contacted my office. Mr. Rossi presented an analysis of the 2020 Risk-Limiting Audit Report ("RLA Report") data, noting 36 inconsistencies reported by Fulton County.¹ The analysis was created by him and attorney Jack James who volunteered their own time, without compensation, to review thousands of ballot images, audit tally sheets, and other data to double-check the work of the county. Their dedication to this immense task is commendable.

The 36 inconsistencies noted by Mr. Rossi are factual in nature, pose no underlying theories outside of the reported data, and could not be explained by my office after a thorough review detailed below. The purpose of this letter is to convey these inconsistencies to the Board and request them to be explained or corrected.

To be clear, this letter does not purport to dispute or contest the outcome of the 2020 election, but rather to highlight apparent inconsistencies discovered in the RLA Report data.

Mr. Rossi requested my office review his findings and take whatever action may be appropriate to address his concerns. Mr. Rossi never alleged the outcome of the election was in question or asked me to act beyond my constitutional or statutory powers as Governor – the authority to oversee elections in Georgia lies with the State Election Board and the Secretary of State.

To determine whether it was appropriate to refer Mr. Rossi's claims to you, my office tested the veracity of his work by independently repeating the research Mr. Rossi conducted on each of his 36 claims. My office analyzed each of Mr. Rossi's 36 claims against the RLA Report data. This process was extensive, required a manual review of thousands of ballot images and audit data, and took weeks to complete.

Based on that analysis, as evidenced in the attached report, I believe a referral to the Board is warranted.

The data that exists in public view on the Secretary of State's website of the RLA Report does not inspire confidence. It is sloppy, inconsistent, and presents questions about what processes were used by Fulton County to arrive at the result. Though reasons for, or explanations of, Mr. Rossi's concerns may exist, they are not apparent in the RLA Report data. In reviewing this matter, I believe the Board should consider the following actions:

- 1. Direct investigators to review Mr. Rossi's findings, just as my office has, and order corrective action as needed to address any verified errors.
- 2. Determine whether any changes should be made to the RLA Report. If so, the Board should determine whether such changes adversely impact the integrity of the RLA Report as originally reported.
- 3. Review the audit methodology used in counties across Georgia and create a prescriptive and uniform set of rules that ensure one process is followed by all counties that result in a clear presentation of data.

As you know, I chaired this Board for nine years. During that time, we tackled many tough issues to ensure the integrity of Georgia's elections and make it easy to vote and hard to cheat. It is the responsibility of this Board to safeguard the confidence I and all my fellow Georgians must have in our elections. This is one issue where I believe this Board must act swiftly, and I urge you to do so in this case.

Review of Inconsistencies in the Data Supporting the Risk Limiting Audit Report

Overview

The following inconsistencies were initially discovered by Joe Rossi through comparisons of the Fulton County vote counts included in the document titled "Detailed Audit Report with Results from all Batch Sheets (Excel)" ("Detailed Audit Report") and the ballot images obtained by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution Open Records Request ("Ballot Images"). Mr. Rossi's analysis ("Rossi Count") and the review conducted by the Office of the Governor ("Internal Count") were performed by manually counting the Ballot Images for Fulton County. The Ballot Images only include absentee ballots.

Within the Detailed Audit Report and Mr. Rossi's analysis, ballot scanners were referred to as Scanners 1 through 5. The Atlanta Journal-Constitution referred to the same scanners as Tabulator 5150 (Scanner 1), Tabulator 5160 (Scanner 2), Tabulator 5162 (Scanner 3), Tabulator 5164 (Scanner 4), and Tabulator 0729 (Scanner 5).

References to "Row XXXXX" refer to the row number listed on the Detailed Audit Report.

As used in the batch entries in the Detailed Audit Report, "I W/I" means "Invalid Write-In Vote", "V W/U" means "Valid Write-In Vote", and "B/U" means "Blank Vote or \cup ndervote".

Judge Duffey,

In terms of an outline for the ORR response letter, I would recommend the following:

Start by stating that the cover letter and production are in response to the ORR dated July 26, 2023 and that you are producing 6 pages (I believe) of documents that are responsive to Request #1.

It sounds like redactions have been made regarding attorney-client privileged material in terms of emails that I was included on regarding discussions for legal advice. In that case, the cover letter should next state that redactions have been made for attorneyclient privileged materials pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72(a)(41). State that other responsive materials are being withheld completely due to attorney client privilege as well as attorney work product. O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72(a)(42). Further, state that in the consent order previously provided to him in response to Request #3, redactions were made pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72(a)(25) (A).

(As we discussed, redactions should not be made within the documents that are being produced solely on the grounds that the portion of the document is non-responsive.)

In terms of Request #2 for all email correspondence of all SEB members from June 1 to July 10, 2023, this is where you would need to provide a reasonable estimate of the cost of the review, which would include reviewing for various exceptions under the Open Records Act, including attorney-client privilege (O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72(a)(41)), attorney work product (O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72(a)(42)), and the exceptions regarding ongoing investigations. O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72(a)(3), (4). There may also need to be additional redactions made related to election security concerns, such as any unredacted versions of the 2021-181 Consent Order with Fulton County, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 50-18-72(a)(25)(A).

I've attached Code Section 50-18-71 and have included the language below regarding the cost of the ORR search. If you are preparing the estimate based on your emails from the time period, we would advise reaching out to other SEB members (or to at least one other Board member) to ask how many emails they have in this time period.

"An agency may impose a reasonable charge for the search, retrieval, redaction, and production or copying costs for the production of records pursuant to this article. An agency shall utilize the most economical means reasonably calculated to identify and produce responsive, nonexcluded documents ... the charge for the search, retrieval, or redaction of records shall not exceed the prorated hourly salary of the lowest paid full-time employee who, in the reasonable discretion of the custodian of the records, has the necessary skill and training to perform the request; provided, however, that no charge shall be made for the first quarter hour." O.C.G.A. § 50-18-71(c)(1).

I did not get the AG document question answered to my satisfaction. I wanted to see the results of the investigation in this case and then have the time to review and opportunity to ask questions before any vote was had on the matter. I understand Sara (at least) also did not have the materials in her binder as well.

As you know, we are subject to oversight, lawsuits, and liability. I am grateful that the AG continues to represent us in litigation as it arises, but they can't represent us if we are breaching our dutics to the state or the legislature. Sara and I need to be particularly concerned because we are - by statute - representatives of the top two political parties and must take into account that dual role. So in that capacity, I am representing a significant number of voters in the state. Not having data like this and voting affirmatively is a serious breach of protocol that interferes with our ability to perform the duties assigned to us.

As for intentionality, I don't know whether it was intentional or not; there is really no way of knowing. The AG's office claims it was merely an "oversight" by Alex but any statement like that is not sufficient to cover up negligence that could ultimately cause liability for any of us. What am I supposed to say in a deposition when I am asked if I believe that I have had access to all the information I need to do my job? I had a two hour Zoom call with the investigator 5 days before the meeting because I wanted to be thorough. But I did not have the materials, and assumed in that call that I was playing with a full deck. Other materials were added, but nothing about 181. How could I have known I was supposed to be asking about matters not present? When the AG cases were conveyed by email, this material was omitted. That is at least some evidence of possible intentionality. —

CONSENT ORDER

The State Election Board, by and through counsel, and the Fulton County Board of Registration and Elections ("Respondent"), hereby enter into the following Consent Order for use in SEB Case Nos. 2021-181 and 2022-025 before the State Election Board in lieu of an evidentiary hearing.

FINDINGS OF FACT and CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth in the following Paragraphs 1 through 5 have been asserted against Respondent.¹ Respondent denies any willful misconduct but desire that the above-captioned case be resolved in its entirety in order to avoid further litigation. Respondent acknowledges that there is evidence of a *prima facie* case supporting the following assertions and enters into this negotiated Consent Order to resolve the issues that arose related to the 2020 General Election in Fulton County, Georgia.

1.

A complaint was submitted to the State Election Board and the Secretary of State's office regarding the risk-limiting audit conducted by Fulton County elections officials for the General

SEB Case 2021-181 also names Richard Barron as an additional Respondent. Mr. Barron is no longer the Elections Director for Fulton County, and he is hereby dismissed.

Election held on November 3, 2020.2

2.

The complainant alleged that there were 36 inconsistencies discovered in the batch tally sheets for the risk-limiting audit conducted following the 2020 General Election, which were included in the data uploaded to the Secretary of State's website.

3.

A thorough investigation into the complaints was conducted by the Secretary of State's investigations division. Investigators met with the complainant, reviewed all of the data and documentation submitted by the complainant, and interviewed other relevant witnesses with knowledge. The results of the investigation showed that Fulton County elections staff misidentified and duplicated audit batch sheet data when entering the data into the Arlo software used by the Secretary of State's office to manage the risk-limiting audit.

4.

By failing to enter all of the audit batch sheet data accurately, Respondent violated SEB Rule 183-1-15-.04 regarding audits. The investigators further concluded that the reported inconsistencies were the result of human error in entering the data, which were not discovered in time to make corrections due to time limitations in completing the risk-limiting audit and the sheer amount of ballots, and not due to intentional misconduct by Fulton County elections staff.

5.

The discovered errors were a fractional number of the total votes counted and did not

² The State Election Board heard the recommendation of the investigators regarding SEB Case No. 2021-181 at the March 16, 2022 Board meeting and voted to bind the case over to the Attorney General's office. On March 31, 2022, an additional complaint was received and designated as SEB Case No. 2022-025. The Secretary of State's investigators determined that SEB Case No. 2022-025 is the same complaint that is at issue in SEB Case No. 2021-181. This Consent Order resolves the allegations against Respondent in both SEB Case Nos. 2021-181 and 2022-025.

affect the result of the 2020 General Election Fulton County, which were confirmed as accurate by the risk-limiting audit. The purpose of the risk-limiting audit was to confirm whether the results of the original tabulation of ballots were accurate, which the audit confirmed.

ORDER

1.

This Consent Order addresses and resolves all matters regarding Respondent in connection with SEB Case Nos. 2021-181 and 2022-025.

2.

The State Election Board, having considered the particular facts and circumstances of this case, inclusive of the within and foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, hereby ORDERS that Respondent cease and desist from further violations of the Election Code.

3.

Respondent hereby agrees to implement written policies and procedures for risk-limiting audits for all elections for which risk-limiting audits are required under SEB Rule 183-1-15-.04, which are attached as **Exhibit A**. Respondent hereby certifies to the State Election Board that it has already implemented these policies and procedures and did so for the 2022 General Election.

4.

Respondent agrees to adequately train all of its elections staff involved in conducting the risk-limiting audit on the policies and procedures in advance of each election.

5.

Members of the Fulton County Board of Registration and Elections have been provided with a copy of this Consent Order and have acknowledged that they understand the contents. Respondent understands that it has a right to a hearing in this matter. Respondent knowingly and voluntarily waives such right to a hearing, as well as any other rights under the Georgia Administrative Procedure Act pertaining to notice and hearing for contested cases, by entering into this Consent Order.

6.

This Consent Order is entered in settlement of disputed matters, and the Consent Order entered herein is not to be construed as an admission of guilt or liability on the part of Respondent but is entered herein to resolve this State Election Board case. This Consent Order is a civil settlement and has no criminal ramifications.

7.

This Consent Order, inclusive of its Stipulations and Order, shall not become effective unless and until approved by the State Election Board at its June 8, 2023, meeting, and the State Board of Elections. If not approved by and executed on behalf of either board, , neither the stipulations nor any other part of this agreement shall have any binding legal effect whatsoever and shall not constitute an admission against interest or prejudice the ability of either the State Election Board or Respondents to adjudicate this matter.

- 1. Sign up for your Arlo account. (You will not need to do this if you already have an account from November)
 - a. Your county office can have 2 Arlo administrator accounts. Those administrator accounts will be able to create accounts for additional users in your office. Only the 2 administrators will be able to complete submission to the Secretary of State at the end of the audit If you need to create an account, please email rla@vx.support.
- 2. As soon as you certify your results at the county level, generate your Cast Vote Records and Tabulator Status Reports.
 - a. For instructions on how to generate these reports, review Appendix A.
 - b. Make sure you use the Tabulator Status report that does not have To_Excel in the file name.
- 3. Upload your Cast Vote Records and Tabulator Status Reports into Arlo.
 - a. For instructions on how to upload these reports, review pages 1 and 2 of Appendix B.
- 4. Download your Batch Inventory Worksheet and verify the ballot counts in the worksheet. Once you have verified the numbers, confirm that you have completed the worksheet by checking the appropriate box in Arlo. Then hit "Continue."
 - a. Review pages 2 and 3 of Appendix B for more information.
- 5. Based on the data you provide, Arlo will generate 2 files: 1. Ballot Manifest; and 2. Candidate Totals by Batch. Download both files, and save them so you can easily access the files.
 - a. Review page 4 of Appendix B for more information.
- 6. After you click, "Return to Audit Source Data," scroll down to the Ballot Manifest and Candidate Totals by Batch sections. Upload the Ballot Manifest file that you just saved, and then upload the Candidate Totals by Batch file that you just saved.
- Wait for your random batch selections to appear in Arlo. The dice roll will be held in the State Capitol on Tuesday, December 13, 2022 in the morning and batch selections should appear in Arlo after 5:00 P.M. for you to download.

Section 2 provides total ballots by batch. Verify each batch is present in your physical inventory and matches your reconciliation form counts. Verify no batches are missing.

If batches are missing, they should be added to your EMS and a new CVR file should be downloaded from the EMS and uploaded into Arlo. If batches are stored differently, please contact us for further instruction.





Then upload each file into Arlo for the audit by selecting the Browse button and locating the file saved on your computer and then selecting Upload for each file.



Your pre-audit files are now uploaded and are ready for the audit to be launched by the Department of State.

Judge Duffey,

I understand that you have asked Sara to open up a new case on Mr. Rossi's complaint against the Secretary of State's office regarding the posting of the county-level RLA results for the 2020 presidential election. I have instructed our investigations division that this office will not be opening up a case on this complaint, for several reasons.

First, Mr. Rossi's complaint fails to state a violation of the Georgia Election Code on its face. His complaint is that the Secretary's Elections Division posted the risk-limiting audit results that Fulton County reported to us on the Secretary's website, which he contends contain errors by Fulton County. Those results can be found here:

2020 General Election Risk-Limiting Audit | Georgia Secretary of State

The county's reported numbers for the RLA were posted to the website to be transparent and provide information to the public. The purpose of the RLA was to confirm the accuracy of the original tabulated results; the numbers reported in the RLA were not the final certified results. Conducting pre-certification audits is a county responsibility under OCGA 21-2-498, and the county bears all responsibility for following the applicable statutes and rules for how the audit is conducted and to report the results accurately. None of the code sections cited by Mr. Rossi apply here or state a claim for any violation against the Secretary's staff.

Second, and more importantly, the SEB has no jurisdiction over this complaint. As I explained in our June 14th meeting, the SEB has no oversight role over the Secretary of State. The reason for this is set forth in AG Opinion 2005-3:

2005-3 | Office of the Attorney General (georgia.gov)

This opinion states in part, "Georgia's Constitution and Election Code make it amply clear that the Secretary is charged with the primary responsibilities required to enforce the state's election laws. There is no indication in the law that the constitutional and statutory authority of this officer should be limited or substantively controlled by a board of political appointees who are not answerable to the electorate for their actions."

Furthermore, even assuming hypothetically that the complaint established a violation (and it does not), the SEB would need to refer the case to the Attorney General's office in order to pursue any legal action, and the AG's office does not take legal action against their own clients. Finally, the Secretary remains an ex officio member of the SEB under OCGA 21-2-30. For all of these reasons, the SEB cannot pursue complaints against the Secretary's office, and to do so would be unprecedented action by the Board.

I trust with this information that the Board will inform Mr. Rossi that no case will be opened on this matter. I'm happy to discuss this further with you at your convenience.

As the State Election Board (the "Board") parefully considers and examines its options as initiated in an email to you from former Chair Duffey on August 5, 2023, the Board Members have decided to extend you the option, if you wish to do so, to brief the Board on any specific, explicit authority under which you contend the Board has jurisduction to hear Complaints against the Secretary of State.

For any authority you cite, you should explain the scope and limits of such authority. For comple, you should highlight whether the authority you cite grants the Board jurisdiction only over the Secretary of State or over some or all of the Secretary of State's staff and office employees (including receptionints and any other "public facing" employee). You should specifically demonstrate how the authority you cite grants the Board jurisdiction to hear complaints against the Secretary of State's investigators who are performing investigations on behalf of the Board. You should address what impact, if any, that such would have on the "symbiotic relationship" between the Board and the Secretary of State's office as described in GA Atty. Gen. Op. No 2005-3 (April 15, 2003) that continues to exist even in light of the passage by the General Assembly of SB 202 is 2022 as well as SB 222 in 2023.

You may take up to thirty (30) days from the date of your receipt of this letter (which receipt is presumed to be three days following the multing hereof). You need not take the full thirty days, but it is made available to you. You should timit your brieflag to fifteen 8.36 x 11 pages, single-sided, double speed with 12-point tent.
